Tina Rivers Ryan

"Paintings Every Art Lover Should See"

THURSDAY | MARCH 19, 2020

An art historian by training, Dr. Tina Rivers Ryan will introduce the audience to five paintings every art lover should see if they want to understand art--and that everyone who doesn't love art should see if they want to fall in love with it. Covering six centuries of paintings in ninety minutes, this lecture looks at five undisputed masterpieces that exemplify how paintings communicate ideas and shape how we see the world. Currently a curator at the Albright-Knox Art Gallery, Dr. Ryan holds five degrees in art history and formerly taught the introduction to Western art at Columbia University.

Louis Masur

"Learning from Lincoln"

TUESDAY | DECEMBER 10, 2019

Louis Masur is Distinguished Professor of American Studies and History at Rutgers University. A graduate of the University at Buffalo and Princeton University, he is a cultural historian who has written on a variety of topics. Masur returns to Sailfish Point to dive into the political and constitutional history during the time of Lincoln. How did Lincoln steer the nation through the Civil War and what principles guided him as he issued an emancipation proclamation and thought about Reconstruction? Masur will discuss the qualities that made Lincoln a great leader and offer reflections on how postwar policy may have differed had he lived.

"Moonshot - John F. Kennedy and Space"

Just months after being elected president of the United States, John F. Kennedy made an astonishing announcement to the nation: we would put a man on the moon by the end of the decade. Douglas Brinkley will take us through an engrossing journey back to the 1960s by re-creating one of humankind's most exciting and ambitious achievements. Brinkley will bring together the extraordinary political, cultural, and scientific factors that fueled the birth and development of NASA and its manned space programs.

Brinkley will discuss the brilliant men and women who made this giant leap possible and the technology that enabled this achievement. His perspective as a historian, along with lengthy interviews with Neil Armstrong, provide unique insight into this audacious endeavor. At the center of this story is John F. Kennedy himself and his intimate involvement with the program. Brinkley also offers insight into future opportunities to mobilize resources and motivate people to achieve the seemingly impossible.

Catherine Sanderson

"Science of Happiness"

You will be surprised at what really makes us happy. What role do money, marriage, friends, children, weather, age, and religion play in making us feel happier? Is happiness stable over time? How can happiness be increased? Professor Catherine Sanderson will describe cutting-edge research from the field of positive psychology on the factors that do (and do not) predict happiness, and provide participants with practical (and relatively easy!) ways to increase their own psychological well-being. Catherine Sanderson is the Manwell Family Professor of Life Sciences (Psychology) at Amherst College. In 2012, she was named one of the country's top 300 professors by the Princeton Review.



David J. Helfand, Ph.D.

"Mysteries of the Universe"

Each of us have, at some point in our life, questioned the origin and evolution of the universe, including the so-called Big Bang, and the vastness that defies human comprehension. Science is now in a position to provide understandable explanations of these concepts, as well as other recently defined phenomena such as Black Holes and Gravity Waves, and the search for intelligent life. On March 31, you have an opportunity to have your questions addressed by Professor David Helfand of Columbia University in a lecture that will be both informative and entertaining for our lay audience. Dr. Helfand has served as chair of the Department of Astronomy and co-director of the Astrophysics Laboratory at Columbia. He is a past president of the American Astronomical Institute and is currently Chair of the American Society of Physics.

He has been inducted into The Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame; The National Sportswriters and Sportscasters Hall of Fame; The U.S. Basketball Writer's Hall of Fame and the Greater D.C. Jewish Sports Hall of Fame.
